Dan Nommensen joined Christian Family Solutions in 1999. He received his BA from Wisconsin Lutheran College and his MA in Counseling Psychology from Trinity International University. Dan has seen clients through our counseling services and has been involved in developing and presenting numerous educational presentations and programs. He is a Licensed Professional Counselor in Wisconsin and Minnesota as well as a Nationally Certified Counselor, a Board Certified TeleMental Health Provider, and a Board Certified Professional Christian Counselor. He is a member of the American Association of Christian Counselors and the Employee Assistance Professionals Association.

Since 2008, Christian Family Solutions has been partnering with congregations, schools, and Christian organizations to provide mental health services to their members, students, or employees. We have provided a Member Assistance Program with congregations to provide counseling services in person at our clinic or by video for members of each congregation. We have provided a School-Based Counseling Partnership Program and placed counselors on site at schools around the country. We have also partnered with Christian-based businesses to provide an **Employee Assistance Program** and help employees and their family members when there are emotional challenges.

When CFS partners with groups in our communities, the goal is to reduce barriers for people to get the help they need. Christian Family Solutions works with each organization to remove the financial barrier so initial sessions are available at no cost. We also provide services not only in person, but also by secure video to help remove the barrier of transportation or even stigma.
